

unu Scooter Factsheet

unu riding

- \rightarrow Range up to 50 km, 100 km with two batteries depending on driving style
- ightarrow Top speed 45 km/h regardless of motor power or remaining battery charge
- \rightarrow Constant top speed (only when the battery has less than 5% of charge remaining the top speed is reduced)
- → Almost silent riding

Equipment

- \rightarrow Seven different body colours and three colours of seat fabric available
- → Seating allows for the external attachment and secure locking of two helmets
- → Lengthened seat has more room for two riders
- \rightarrow Space for two batteries beneath the seating unit
- → Two-year warranty on unu and battery subject to regular maintenance inspections

Technology and motor

- ightarrow Brushless electric hub motor by Bosch
- \rightarrow Outputs 1000 Watt, 2000 Watt and 3000 Watt (top speed independent of motor power)
- \rightarrow Maximum climb capability (solo rider)

 \rightarrow Acceleration (0 - 45 km/h)

1000 W : 17 s 2000 W : 14 s 3000 W : 12 s

- \rightarrow Brakes \rightarrow Hydraulic disc brake at the front, drum brake at the rear
- \rightarrow KERS (Kinetic Energy Recovery System) \rightarrow Extended range through recovery of braking energy up to 10%
- → Heidenau tyres (made in Germany)

Dimensions

- → Overall length 170 cm, height 103 cm (without mirrors), width 66 cm
- → Weight approx. 58 kg without battery (67 kg including battery)
- → Maximum load 150 kg
- \rightarrow 10 inch wheel rims (tyre size 3.00-10)

Authorization

- → Authorized for two persons
- → Certified by the TÜV Rheinland inspection authority
- → Requires in Germany either a full driving license or a 'Class M' permit
- → Authorized in Germany, Austria and Switzerland
- → Maintenance inspection costs → 70 100 € (depending on service partner)

Insurance (estimated annual cost)

- → Germany < 23 years old 75 €, > 23 years old 40 €
- → Austria 133 €
- → Switzerland < 25 years old 150 CHF, > 25 years old 125 CHF

unu battery Factsheet

Abstract

- \rightarrow Up to 50 km range on a single battery charge
- → Battery weight approximately 9 kg
- → Portable

General information

- \rightarrow Recharging at any standard (230 V) electricity outlet without noise
- → Cells protected by a brushed aluminium housing
- \rightarrow Recharging at any time, no 'memory effect'
- → Lithium ion battery
- \rightarrow 50,4 V / 28,5 Ah \rightarrow Charging time approximately 5 h (70 % charge after approx. 2 h)
- \rightarrow Average consumption approximately 0.80 € per hundred driven km

Care and storage

What can I do to get the maximum range?

- \rightarrow Check tyre pressure (2.5 Bar) \rightarrow lower pressure \rightarrow higher energy use
- ightarrow Anticipatory driving style ightarrow Acceleration uses 1/3 more electricity than constant speed driving
- → Sudden extreme acceleration increases power consumption even further
- ightarrow Weight ightarrow The heavier the load, the greater the power consumption when accelerating
- ightarrow 'Stop and Go' traffic has a significant negative effect on driving range
- \rightarrow Temperature \rightarrow At +10 °C the battery capacity is reduced by 3 %,
- at -10 °C by 6 %, compared with capacity at +25 °C
- → The battery will remain in optimum condition when half-charged

- \rightarrow If you will not be using your unu for an extended period of time, ensure that the battery is half charged
- ightarrow If you must leave your unu outdoors overnight in winter, the battery will be happier if kept indoors

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
